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EXIS Project Description

Law enforcement discrimination and harassment against LGBTQI+ people as a result of their sexual orientation, gender identity and/or gender expression and sex characteristics is a persistent and pervasive problem in LGBTQI+ community.

EXIS aims to develop a multidisciplinary police reporting approach that effectively responds to crimes against the LGBTQI+ community, as well as to establish a non-biased culture of approach when dealing with LGBTQI+ community.

Through capacity-building activities based on identified needs and gaps, the EXIS project focuses on increasing knowledge and strengthening multidisciplinary cooperation among police officers and civil society organizations. The aim is to effectively respond to the needs of the LGBTQI+ community and prevent crimes against them.

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Objectives

Law enforcement agencies discrimination and harassment based on sexual orientation, gender identity and expression and sex characteristics is a persistent and pervasive problem of the LGBTIQ+ community.

To develop a targeted framework that promotes more effective inter-agency cooperation, based on the analysis of best practices and primary research evidence.

To enhance the competencies of 230 police officers in human rights protection, effective communication, and the protection of LGBTIQ+ community against discrimination, hate speech, and racist crimes.

To pilot test an intersectoral e-networking portal, through 9 EXIS Working Teams, 36 consultation meetings, 18 psychosocial group sessions, and 18 mentoring sessions.
